TODAY'S GOSPEL: JOHN 3:13-21

No one has ascended into heaven but he who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

TO EXALT: TO RAISE ON HIGH, ELEVATE, TO PRAISE, GLORIFY

The Feast of the Elevation of the Holy Cross commemorates the emancipation of the Cross of Christ from Persia and its elevation on the Calvary in Jerusalem. When the Persian King occupied Jerusalem in 610 AD, he took the Cross of Christ to Persia as bondage, in order to insult the Christian community. In 628 AD, Emperor Heracles of Constantinople conquered Persia, emancipated the Cross of Christ and brought it back to Jerusalem.

The Armenian people also had their share in this event. When the Cross was emancipated from Persia, it was brought first to the city of Garin in Armenia; it was carried through Armenia into Constantinople and then to Jerusalem. Patriarch Zakariah of Jerusalem decorated the Cross with roses and flowers and erected it on the elevation of Calvary. On this occasion the Church of Jerusalem celebrated the emancipation of the Cross of Christ with great honor and much enthusiasm in order to inspire the people with the spiritual meaning of the Cross.

Following the Holy *Badarak* the order of *ANTASDAN* takes place, when the four corners of the world are blessed. During *Antasdan*, the Holy Cross is decorated with *rehan*, fresh sweet basil. The word basil in Greek means king, and royal regalia covers the Cross of Christ the King. During the procession, rose water is sprinkled upon the congregation by the presiding clergyman. The congregation takes sprigs of basil home, and being sprinkled with rose water, they take its fragrance and the blessings which both impart to their homes.

At the end of the *ANTASDAN*, we sing the hymn "To Thy Cross, O Christ, we bow down. Thy Holy Burial we magnify, and Thy Holy Resurrection we glorify." The service concludes with a Gospel Reading, and the entire congregation comes forward to kiss the Holy Cross and take sprigs of basil home with them as a token of Christ's Glory.

A PRAYER FOR PROTECTION

O Christ our God, under the protection of Your Holy and Venerable Cross, guard us and keep us in Peace. Deliver us from all adversity and harm's way, seen and unseen. And always make us worthy with great thanksgiving to adore you, with the Father and the Holy Spirit, now and forever and ever. Amen.
